The West Central & Central Regional Centers of the Florida Public Archaeology Network (FPAN) are seeking proposals for Digital Outreach Challenge Grants from 2D visual artists, graphic designers, and digital content creators. These grants are envisioned to stimulate public outreach focused on Racial Justice in Florida archaeology and cultural resource preservation, and are further envisioned to support BIPOC digital content creators.

While we look to create digital content for two preservation projects in Alachua County, we are also interested in your ideas for content related to archaeology and Blackness, and legacies of Anti-Black and Anti-Indigenous racism as revealed by archaeology or as practiced by archaeologists in Florida. Preferred digital submissions may feature comic strip or similar style of graphic storytelling; infographics or fact sheets, creation of ArcGIS Storymaps; and videos or series of short videos.
