

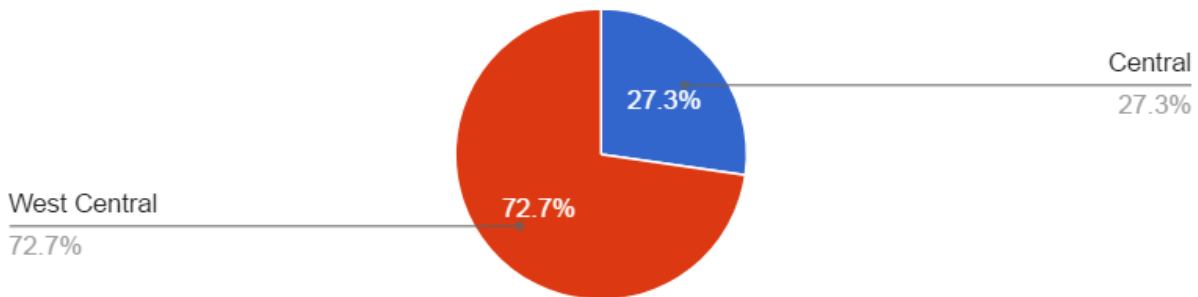

Quarter Highlights:

- Working with the City of Tampa, FPAN staff coordinated renewed preservation efforts at Tampa's oldest public burying grounds, Oaklawn Cemetery. To begin, FPAN staff, USF Anthropology professor, Dr. Tom Pluckhahn, and student volunteers conducted remote sensing and mapping survey of the cemetery.
